





3) Take a weighted elective.

Weighted System – Only subjects in the five traditional areas of English, World Language, Mathematics, Science, Social Studies, as well as Gifted/Talented Seminar, Advanced Placement and all other courses designed as Honors courses are included in this GPA calculation system.

The High School Plus program in partnership with Camden County College (CCC) is designed to accelerate student achievement by awarding college credits for college-level work completed while in high school.

## Courses are freshman-level college courses in areas such as

- Foreign Language
- Computer Science
- History
- Math
- Chemistry
- Physics
- Biology
- Psychology



## Dual Credit courses are

- select high school courses offered at Eastern
- taught by Eastern faculty and are approved by CCC faculty for dual credit status.
- usually Honors or AP high school courses
- certified as containing all the components of the college-level course

Upon graduation from Eastern, students may choose to attend Camden County College or transfer their credits to a four-year school.

(Credit acceptance is ultimately the decision of each four-year school from which the student is seeking credit, and any question concerning the transferability of credit should be directed to that institution.)

## How does a student apply for credit?

- Complete the application/registration form on CCC website
- Both parents and student must sign the Required Statement.
- Make payment to CCC

How does a student earn the credit?

Complete the course according to all CCC requirements and with a grade-requirement determined by CCC to receive college credit.


CCC provides a transcript at a fee, and it is available directly from CCC in mid-summer following the end of the high school year.

Please note: the CCC credit does not appear on the Eastern transcript.
