How time flies! I would like to begin scheduling juniors for senior year. Please complete the attached scheduling sheet with your parents and then log into PowerSchool between December 2, 2024 and December 13, 2024.

Helpful guidelines - *Before logging into PowerSchool to complete your course selection process:*

Consult your teacher and parents for advice. Look at your current level to determine next year's academic level. If you are at 83% or higher, you may consider going to the next level. To review courses that can earn college credit, please click here to review the **College Now at Eastern Handbook** or go to go to <https://www.eccrsd.us/Page/1218> to access the handbook link.

1. Everyone needs an English class; select the appropriate level.
2. Everyone needs Health and PE.
3. You must carry 30 credits as a minimum each year during your high school career – so think carefully about what classes you want to take in your senior year. Your senior year course load will be examined closely by college admissions committees – so this requires a great deal of thought on your part.
4. Colleges like to see academic electives so do not load up on the non-academic electives unless you are going into that field.
5. Provide 15 credits or more of alternate choices.
6. If you do not meet district prerequisites for a particular course, a completed course waiver form will be required. The waiver period is from December 2, 2024 to April 30, 2025. You may obtain a waiver form from me.
7. Upon completion of your work in PowerSchool and receipt of your course selection worksheet, I will review with you your requests to ensure that you have selected the appropriate courses for your senior year.
8. Students selecting Option 2 or Senior Early Release Privilege should select a full schedule; changes will be made when you meet with me.
