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# AP Scholar Awards

The College Board's Advanced Placement Program (AP) provides willing and academically prepared students with the opportunity to take rigorous college-level courses while still in high school, and to earn college credit, advanced placement, or both for successful performance on the AP Exams.

The College Board recognizes several levels of achievement based on students' performance on AP

#### AT EASTERN

Forty-three students were granted the National AP Scholar Award. These students received scores of 3 or higher on three or more AP Exams.

Twenty-eight students were granted the AP Scholar with Honor Award. An average score of at least 3.25 on all AP Exams taken, and scores of 3 or higher on four or more of these exams.

Forty-seven students qualified for the AP Scholar with Distinction Award by earning an average score of at least 3.5 on all AP Exams taken, and scores of 3 or higher on five or more of these
